Transition into KS2

• Y 2 and Y 3 staff have worked alongside each other to ensure a smooth handover.

Main changes:

- Classes: Y 2 staff have mixed the classes (taking the children's wishes, staff knowledge of the children and needs of individuals into account e.g. SEND, language).
- Children have done many activities in their new classes this term to help them build friendships ready for the Autumn Term.
- Length of the day : pick up at 3.30pm
- Lunchtime-12.30-1.30 : A later lunch and 15-minute shorter



Encouraging Independence

At the start of **every** day bring:

- A water bottle: school design, in house -colour, with name and class on please. (Available from the school office.)
- Lunch box if applicable
- Burgundy Book bag No rucksacks please!!
- Toast money or piece of fruit/vegetable
- Musical instrument if taking lessons in school

Core Curriculum

Literacy

• A broad curriculum which includes a variety of writing, handwriting, comprehension, reading, spelling, grammar and speaking and listening.

Maths

- Revisit skills taught in Year 2 and introduce a variety of calculation methods and strategies to aid fluency, problem solving and reasoning.
- A focus on place value, number bonds and the learning of multiplication and division facts.
- National Curriculum Units: number, shape, measures, data and time.

Science

- A balanced, practical approach developing scientific enquiry skills through studying the topics: Animals inc humans, Rocks, Plants, Forces, Light and Relationships and Health Education (RHE) throughout the year.

Reading

Please do not put water bottles in book bags as they often leak!

Children should bring book bags in every day (One identifying key ring is allowed.). No rucksacks please!

Your Child will have:

- A staged reading book **and** a choice book.
- A Reading Diary they themselves write a comment
 - Different to KS1 where parents commented, instead we ask the child to first write their own comment.
 - Parents, sign your child's diary after they have commented, to confirm they have finished their book.
- Children are expected to change their stage book <u>independently</u> <u>at least once a week</u>.

(We will be teaching them how to do this in the first few weeks of the Autumn Term).

Weekly Homework

Reading

- Read for at least 10 minutes every day and record their reading in their reading diary.
- Read from a wide a range of texts- Summer Reading Challenge!
- Books to be brought to school daily.

Spellings (tested on Fridays)

Each week the children will be introduced to a new spelling rule and activities to support their learning of this rule will be shared on Purple Mash. Please encourage your child to complete the tasks as they help consolidate learning.

Mathematics

- Activities will be put on Purple Mash: fortnightly sometimes worksheet, sometimes online game. PDFs can be annotated online, printing not always required.
- TTRS: A log in will be given for this site to enable children to use it and to participate in times tables battles as a part of whole KS2 learning initiative. We have a weekly times tables test.


Ideas for Supporting your child

- Times tables at speed (begin with 2, 5, 10, followed by 4, 8, 3 and 6).
- Quick Recall of Number bonds to 10, 20, 50, 100.
- Relate Maths to everyday life (e.g. telling the time, cooking and using money)
- Telling and writing short stories.
- Encourage writing for a purpose eg. shopping lists, notes and diary.
- Developing vocabulary through talk.
- Reading at home daily.
- Book reviews.


