Our year 6 children will soon be starting a very new chapter in their lives! Each Secondary School organises transition events for their intake of all new children and they will have been in contact with you about this.

We are also liaising with schools to provide additional support.

These are some of the things that have been happening this term to support our SEN Children with their transition:

- Extra transition visits

- Attendance of new school staff at review meetings

- A transition programme for pupils in school, looking at possible challenges such as timetables, planners, moving around the building, saying goodbye to old friends, facing change

- Liaison between us and the SENCo of the new school

- Visits by Secondary school key worker or SENCo to meet children and see them in their current setting

- The passing on of information for the new school around the support that we have found effective in our school

We've had a few hot days in school this week and I thought it would be useful to clarify how Harborne Primary School will respond to hot weather.

*Please note: our approach will change depending on the severity of the forecast heat.* 

#### Normal hot, summery weather

All children should come to school having already applied all day or long lasting sun cream at home. Although the situation will be frequently monitored, school staff will still look to take the children outside for some fresh air during hot weather. Children also need to bring a sunhat and a water bottle, both of which should be named please.

### Amber Warning

Should the Met Office issue an Amber warning for heat for the B17 area, families should follow the guidance above, but children will also be free to come to school wearing their PE kits should they wish. School staff will restrict the amount of time children spend in the sun during the hottest parts of the day, looking to take groups of pupils to shaded spaces outside or back inside the building. Adults in school will also take care to remind pupils to drink frequently and to top up their water bottles when needed.

# <u>Red Warning</u>

Should the Met Office issue a Red warning for extreme heat for the B17 area, parents can decide whether or not it is safe for them to bring their children into school. A Red warning indicates that the forecast weather is dangerous and that families should take action to protect themselves.

In these very extreme circumstances, an absence due to heat will be authorised, but families should contact the school to explain their child's absence in the usual manner. Families that do decide to send their children into school should follow the guidance above regarding sun cream, sunhats, water bottles and clothing. The school will also offer a window for early collection of children should families feel that is the best option for them. The timings of this window will be shared on the day.

We don't anticipate having to close the whole school due to extreme heat so after school clubs will continue to run as normal. We want to give families the opportunity to risk assess their own situation and make the decision that they feel is best for them.

I'm sure many families will remember the very extreme heat we all experienced last summer and while I'm not aware of the same being forecast for this year, it's worth sharing how the school will respond should the same happen again.

#### Apply online for your child's secondary school place - September 2024

Your child is due to transfer from primary to secondary school in September 2024. Local authorities co-ordinate secondary transfer admissions for all maintained (non-fee paying) schools. This means parent/carers should apply to the local authority in which they live (the council to which they pay council tax).

If you live in Birmingham you should apply for your child's secondary school place online at <u>www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions</u> between 1 September and 31 October 2023. It is important that you submit your application by 31 October 2023. **Applications received after the national closing date of 31 October 2023 will be treated as late applications.** Late applicants are less likely to be offered a place at one of their preferred schools, as these applications will be processed after 1 March 2024, in accordance with Birmingham's coordinated admissions scheme.

We know this is an important time for you and your child. and we encourage you to find out as much as you can about local schools and how the admissions process works before you make your application, as a lack of awareness of the correct procedures may affect the outcome of your application.

# Information about the application process will be available on the council's website, <u>www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions</u> from 1 September 2023.

The website includes information on types of schools, how to apply online, how places are offered, details of the individual schools and their admissions arrangements, and what to do if you are not offered one of your preferred schools. If you do not have a device that can access the internet, your child's primary school may be able to help you. You may also be able to access a computer via a friend or relative.

We strongly advise you visit the websites of your preferred schools for further information about the school and details of any open days or evenings. You should also carefully consider how likely you are to be offered a place at one of your preferred schools, and find out more about the order in which places are offered (oversubscription criteria) by reading the information on the schools you are interested in. Please note that before completing your online application you **must** confirm that you have read the admissions arrangements.

If you are applying for any school under the distance category, make sure you check the last distance an applicant was offered from over the past three years (where applicable). While this **is no guarantee** that your application will be successful for September 2024, it will give an indication of whether you should consider including the school as one of your preferences.

We advise you to use all six preferences to maximise your chances of getting a place at one of the schools you prefer.

You can amend your school preferences on the online admissions form as many times as you like until the closing date of 31 October 2023. Please remember that, if you do make amendments to your original online admissions form, you **must re-submit** your application for the latest changes to take effect by selecting **submit** again. If you do not re-submit your application after going back in to make changes, your previously submitted application will remain, and your new one will be disregarded.

Your application will be processed using the address currently held by your child's primary/junior school. Please note, if the address on your application differs from the address held on our database, you will be asked to send us proof of your address in the form of your most recent council tax bill for 2023/2024. **If you do not provide adequate proof of address by the closing date of 31 October 2023, your child's application will not be processed.** For further information, please visit the "Proof of Address" section in the School Admissions webpages: <u>Proof of address: transfer to year 7 and start of school in reception year | Proof of home address for school admissions | Birmingham City Council</u>

You will receive an email confirming which school your child has been offered by the end of the day on 1 March 2024.

### Family Hubs - July update

Work on Family Hubs is continuing at pace and we are delighted to share free resources, funded through the programme that are already available in Birmingham for families and professionals alike.

Our latest Family Hubs workshop was enthusiastically attended and we are grateful to the 50+ people who attended on the day. More below.

We are very pleased to share the 'Best Start for Life' website which is now live. We would welcome your comments on it as it develops and grows. We want this to be the best 'one stop shop' in the City for expectant parents and those with very young children.

#### **5th Family Hubs workshop**

#### The 'Best Start for Life' website is now live – have your say!

We are delighted that the Best Start for Life website is now live! 'Best Start for Life' is a part of the Family Hubs programme that helps families with children aged 0-19 or 25 who have special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). 'Best Start for Life' focuses on support, information and resources from conception until a child is 2 years old. This is the important first 1001 days where the foundations of a child's life are built.

Co-production on the website is underway and we are developing a city wide parent/carer advisory group to help us to produce the best and most useful website. The full Family Hubs website will follow in the Autumn. We are continuing to work on our branding for 'Family Hubs' and 'Best Start for Life' and we want to involve partners, families and children and young people in helping to choose the brand for Birmingham. Look out for more on this soon.

### **Resources Already Available to Families**

Family Hubs is already offering 3 resources for parents, carers and professionals to access for free:

The Solihull Approach – free online Parenting Courses

<u>The Solihull Approach</u> offers a range of free online courses for parents/carers and professionals covering a wide range of subject from conception to parenting 19 year olds. Birmingham City Council has bought the licence to the course (worth £88 each) for everyone in the City. Just use the word 'COMMUNITY' as the password.

- The evidence based courses range from 'Understanding Your Baby' to 'Understanding the Teenage Brain' and include help with children and young people's mental health
- There are additional courses for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities
- The courses have been developed with practitioners and parents since 1996

#### The Family Hubs Workshop - Service Mapping: June 2023

We are very grateful to the 50+ people who attended our latest partnership Family Hubs workshop at the MAC on Monday 26th June. The day was very interesting and informative as we looked at all the resources available to families in Birmingham, barriers to accessing services and how to overcome those. We had some very helpful feedback from the rich discussions had on the day; all of the comments and feedback will be taken on board to further inform the development of Family Hubs across the City.





We also enjoyed a very interesting session on the data available to us in the City and how we might share that more effectively.

A follow up workshop will be taking place in early Autumn where we will bring key stakeholders and partners back together. In the meantime, we will be doing locality level engagement over the coming weeks, as well as working with individual services to continue to map out their offer, ensuring join up across the City between services. We will ensure that all relevant information is available on the <u>'Best Start for Life'</u> website.

#### Themes from the Day

Six key themes emerged from the tabletop activity around barriers to accessing services:

- Sustainability of funding
- Accessibility: everyone knows where and how to access support
- Accessibility: language and cultural barriers
- Accessibility: financial costs of accessing services
- Stigma attached to accessing services
- Looking at our own approach

Following on from identifying challenges, we are hoping to develop a partnership approach to engagement, access to services and local needs.
