We understand that hospital clinics and emergency appointment may warrant some time off school but please try to minimise absence from learning time wherever possible, Thank you.

Food in School

We have been surprised by the recent rise in KS1 children — especially in Year One at our Main Site, who are bringing food from home into school. As all parents should be aware, the Government funds a free, healthy morning snack and a choice of hot and cold lunchtime meals for all children in Reception, Year One and Year Two. Therefore there should be no need for any child in these years to bring any food from home except in very exceptional circumstances.

We have many children with dietary restrictions and/or allergies in school and whilst we feel we are able to manage these safely with "school food" it is much more difficult when other food is coming into the building from homes, and we are not aware of what is being brought in. We do not feel it is our place to "check" lunch bags etc from home but are concerned they could contain allergens or that these young children may want to share food with friends which may go against what their own parents would want them to eat.

So can we please ask that you do not send any food from home **unless this has already been agreed** with the Year group leader (Mrs D'Arcy or Mrs Gwilt in Reception, Mrs Gaynor in Year One and Mrs O'Brien in Year Two.) Annex parents should contact Mrs Walters. Thank you.

Head Bumps

As you are aware we have modified our practice around head bumps. We feel that the use of wristbands as recommended on our training update is clear and helpful. We wanted to clarify the significance of the two coloured bands and how we use them.

To re-cap, both yellow and orange bands warn all adults to watch out for signs of concussion-yellow is not necessarily "less serious". The only difference is that orange means parents have already been contacted.


When a child presents with a bumped head three factors need to be considered by First Aid staff. This helps them decide to call parents immediately which in turn means whether to use a yellow band or an orange one.

These are the three factors in order of importance.

- 1) How the child is presenting... are they crying? calm? looking clammy? Can they talk and respond normally? Is there a visible mark or bump at all? All this will be monitored while they are in First Aid with an ice pack on the injury.
- 2) What do we know about how the injury occurred? Do we know what they bumped their head on? Did they fall from a height? Does a reliable witness say it looked like a "bad fall" even if the child is making light of it?
- What is happening between time of injury and time child gets back to parents? So for example if the accident occurs at 3pm we are much less likely to phone parents if we know they will be picking up the child in twenty minutes anyway and we can speak to them face to face then. However if the child was due to attend an after school sports club we would be more likely to call them.

So as you can see there is a lot to consider! First Aiders are only able to deal with what is apparent at the time. A yellow band tells our staff to keep monitoring and so you may get a call later on that day to say that your child is now complaining of feeling sick or having a headache.

We do **not** have a blanket rule that a visible mark leads to a call and no mark means no call but you can expect that information about the head bump will be communicated to you by phone, face to face or by the presence of a slip on the day it happens.





Christmas Concert at St Mary's Church

We would like to invite you to our Christmas Concert on Tuesday 5th December, 6.00pm at St Mary's Church, Vivian Road, Harborne.

We would also ask that if younger children become unsettled, that they are not allowed to run around in the church but are taken into the foyer so that the performers are not distracted, and the concert is not disrupted for others.

It promises to be a wonderful evening judging by the rehearsals so far! The children have been working extra hard to make sure we are ready, and I know you will all enjoy hearing them perform. We hope to see you there!


Here are some examples of some Winter Scenes to inspire you:
